On behalf of the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association, I'd like to thank you for all of your hard work and dedication to the sport of volleyball throughout your high school careers. Many of you know how challenging, inspiring, and addicting this great sport can be. Hopefully, you're eager to continue playing competitive volleyball after high school. If you plan on attending a community college or a four-year college or university, you will most likely have the opportunity to compete at one of three levels: NCAA or NAIA Varsity Volleyball, NIRSA Intercollegiate Club Volleyball, or intramural volleyball.

As many of you already know, the number of major universities in the east that sponsor men's volleyball as a varsity sport is limited.
